Despite her battle with lung cancer, Mom faced each day with courage and resilience. She surpassed every medical expectation, fighting fiercely for almost a decade longer than anyone anticipated. Her love for dad was the driving force in her determination to stay by his side. During her final days, Mom was surrounded by her devoted husband, children, grandchildren, and family. Despite the toll cancer had taken on her body, her spirit remained resilient, and her spunkiness shone through, bringing comfort and warmth to those around her. Mom is survived by her loving husband, Don Triplett Sr.; her children and their spouses: Don and Doni Triplett of Sachse, TX; Rick and Della Triplett of Ashland, KY; Gary and Avanelle Triplett of South Point, OH; her siblings: Shirley, Annette, Carolyn, and Elmer (Junior); as well as numerous grandchildren, great-grandchildren, extended family members, and friends. In her passing, Mom leaves behind a legacy of love, strength, and unwavering devotion. She will be deeply missed by all who had the privilege of knowing her.
