**W**illiam Clyde “Tom” Taylor, Jr., 81, of Chesapeake, Ohio, passed away on Tuesday, April 29, 2025, at St. Mary’s Medical Center, Huntington, WV surrounded by his family that he dearly loved. Tom was born July 13, 1943, to the late William Clyde Taylor, Sr. and Betty Bowles Taylor Parsons in Huntington, WV. He was a proud veteran of the United States Air Force, honorably discharged on March 7, 1967. He then began his career at the Nickel Plant in Huntington, WV. He worked his way through the ranks to Supervisor of Maintenance and retired in 1995. Being a master electrician, he also was sole owner of River Cities Electric Heating and Air. Tom was a member of the South Point Masonic Lodge #497. One of his proudest moments was on July 25, 2019, when he participated in the induction ceremony for his grandson Ryan Taylor becoming a master mason. He also was a past member of Abundant Life Baptist Church. Tom had a loving and giving heart, always ready and willing to help anyone in need.
