Those who knew Chubby remember him as a vibrant personality whose humor and warmth lit up every room he entered. He had a unique gift for connecting with people and making them feel seen and valued. Whether through his artistic creations or the songs he played from the depths of his soul, Chubby left an indelible mark on all who crossed paths with him.
